This Sunday's readings emphasize the need for Christians to abide in Christ as a condition for producing fruits. The reading from the Acts of the Apostles, testifies to the spiritual fruits yielded by the apostles and Paul because of their close bond with the risen Lord. At first the apostles

were unable to believe that Paul was one among them. Barnabas explained to the apostles how Jesus had spoken to Paul and the Divine intervention of Jesus in the life of Paul. The reading tells us how the Lord changed the heart of Paul, to make him dedicated to the proclamation of the Gospel.

The Second Reading instructs the disciples to love in truth and in action. John reminds them that love is more than mere words or feelings. Through our actions, we are to bear fruit as the disciples of Jesus. Through our faith in Jesus and our love towards others, the Heavenly Father is glorified.

Jesus says, "I am the vine, you are the branches,". We have great strength and power when we are attached to the Eternal Vine, Jesus Christ. Our strength comes from our union with Christ.

Today's gospel reminds us that the discipleship is not a passive affair; we are made part of Christ so that through us the Father's kingdom can come closer to all humanity. Without Jesus as the centre of unity, we lose our way. The church, the community of Jesus will prosper only if we are connected to Him and through Him to one another.

The Church is strong due to people who are extremely generous with their time, talent, and resources. We are under the beautiful umbrella of Christ's love. We all get our life from the main Vine. We must always remain united to our Lord by prayer and continuous reception of sacraments because He is the Vine, and we are the branches.
